PRELIMINARY SCHEDULE

The PRELIMINARY trial schedule for each day can be found below. The final schedule, judge assignments and run order will be determined by the number of entries in each class and may be modified if entry projections are inaccurate. Times are approximate.

This trial will use the REMIND app to provide information to entered teams. Use of the REMIND app is optional. There will also be an information station in the crating area to keep handlers aware of what classes are running.

The detective class will run using a run order. Major workers running detective will be scheduled to run first. A special REMIND group will be used to keep handlers informed.

Lunch breaks will be taken at the judge's discretion.

The general briefing will take place at 8:30 each morning. The general briefing will include a site tour to help those entered navigate the trial site.

NOTE: Briefing times are staggered to allow teams entering dogs at multiple levels time to attend each briefing. The numbers 1, 2, 3 in each day's schedule refer to the order in which the briefings will occur.

ELIGIBLE DOGS

Dog Eligible to Enter: This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or are approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds.

Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, the dog displays no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Deaf and blind dogs are allowed to enter.

Per AKC, females in season may not participate. Aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from an injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance, may not participate. No dog shall compete if it is sutured, bandaged, or has any visible wounds.

ENTRY FEES

An entry is defined as a single run by a single dog, in a single class.

First entry each element............\$20.00 (includes a \$3.50 AKC recording fee)

Detective class entry...............\$40.00 (includes a \$3.50 AKC recording fee)

No hand delivered entries. No entries accepted by phone or fax. No entry shall be made, and no entry shall be accepted that specifies any condition as to its acceptance.

Non-legible entries will not be processed. Any returned checks will not constitute a valid entry and will be assessed a \$20.00 collection fee.

WAIT LIST INFORMATION

There will be a waitlist to fill potential openings created by withdrawn entries, with a limit of 30.

STAGING AREA, HANDLER'S BRIEFING, AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Staging Area: The staging area will be out of view of search area(s) and will include a waiting area.

Handler's Briefing: The handler's briefing will take place after the Demo Dog has run. The briefing, at the Judge's discretion, will be either a group briefing prior to the start of each class OR an individual briefing on the line prior to the run. In the Handler's Briefing the judge will explain if there is an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search.

Warm-up area: A warm-up area will be available consisting of ONE marked container of each odor being tested at the trial and blank containers. Exhibitors should limit their warm-up to (2) two minutes or less. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the handler-dog team prior to their run, or for recovery after the run. The warm-up area is not for training or relieving of the dog. Please be considerate of others using the area.

SEARCH AREAS AND TRIAL SITE INFORMATION

Search Areas: Searches indoors may be on the following surfaces: concrete, carpet, dirt, matts, or tiled surfaces. Searches outdoors may be on grass, gravel, dirt, concrete, or asphalt surfaces.

Search Area Sizes: Search areas size will be as stated in the AKC regulations for all elements and levels.

Trial Site: It is not appropriate to visit the trial location prior to the trial date.

Indoor Crating: Indoor crating is available. Please bring a waterproof mat to place under your crate. Metal x pens with metal, attached covers will be allowed. Soft-sided or open x pens cannot be used.

ADDITIONAL TRIAL INFORMATION

Refunds: Entry fee will not be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Event Committee. Dogs pulled after closing because of injury or other medical condition are not eligible for a refund unless they can be replaced by a waitlisted entry.

Bitches in season: Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fee. Notification in writing must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial.

Final Confirmation Email: A final confirmation email will be sent out at least one week prior to the trial. This email will include a full and final schedule of class run orders, the check-in location, and times of check-in.

In addition, a map of the trial site with search locations for each of the three trial days, as well as the designated parking area, will be included with the final confirmation.

RIBBONS, AWARDS, AND PRIZES

Placement ribbons will be awarded in each class as follows:

A New Title ribbon will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title.

HIGH IN TRIAL (HIT)

Only teams who participate in the same difficulty level in all elements offered (Container, Interior, Exterior, Buried), and qualify in each are eligible to win High in Trial. One High In Trial winner is chosen per difficulty level; there is no separate High In Trial for the Novice A and Novice B sections. The High in Trial is determined by adding the team's faults across the elements. If there is a tie based on faults, then the team's times across the elements will be summed and the faster-finishing team will win. The High in Trial award is not recorded by the AKC. Teams winning High In Trial will earn a Rosette.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS – AKC REGULATIONS

It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to read and understand the current regulations for Scent Work prior to participating in this event. All exhibitors should obtain a copy of the Regulations for Scent Work, by downloading them here: http://images.akc.org/pdf/rulebooks/RSW001.pdf

Possession of Odor: Possession of odor should only be by those engaged in the administration of the trial. It is not appropriate for participants to bring odor on to the trial site. Possession of odor at the trial by those not administering the trial is grounds for dismissal without a refund.

Exhibitor's Responsibility: Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds. Please be considerate and leave the area as clean as you found it.

Spectators: Spectators are encouraged where the venue configuration reasonably allows it. The judge's determination of appropriate location for spectators is final. It may be possible for a single individual to accompany a team to video. Any individual serving as the designated videographer for a running dog does so at the sole responsibility of the running team. Interference in the run by a videographer is at the risk of the running team.

Safety, Behavior and Liability: The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are

familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Event Committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The American Kennel Club and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The American Kennel Club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the American Kennel Club or any official thereof.

Collars, Leashes and Harnesses:

During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. A wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

All dogs must be on leash at all times. Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search.

Special training devices that are used to control and train dogs, including, but not limited to, collars with prongs, electronic collars used with transmitters, muzzles, and head collars may not be used on dogs at AKC events.

Ringside:

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. While every effort will be made to ensure all dogs entered and present are run, the club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

I (we) agree that the club holding this event has the right to refuse this entry for cause which the club shall deem sufficient. I (we) certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs.
